Il be honest. I haven't always enjoyed asking questions. There was a time when questions made me uncomfortable because I felt like I was displaying ignorance or lack of trust in an area where I should be stronger. I also felt vulnerable with some of the fears I had that would lead to the questioning. Then I never liked being asked something that my own jury was still out on because then I felt pressured. But, I have grown and something beautiful called curiosity and trust has been stronger as I continue in my unfolding journey of me.

I'm learning to love the questions. Not because I always find answers right away, but because I've come to trust that the answers are already present. They don't come from striving or stressing. They come from tuning in. They come when I am willing to ask with sincerity and trusting expectancy. Curiosity is my comforting friend and helped me see that no matter the situation, it's okay to be unsure, curious, or afraid so then the sacred call of questioning invites me into something deeper. And it humbles me as well as opens me to receive what has been there all along.

I'm discovering that the more I ask, the more I receive. Not always what I expected, but always what I needed. This past few years of my journey has reminded me that asking questions is not a lack of faith, it's trust at its finest. It's also learning and it's helping us enhance our levels of awareness. It says, I am open, listening, and peacefully ready to see what's next in this amazing journey for me. In this season of unfolding and resurrection, I am beginning to see that every honest question brings me closer to the highest version of myself.

So homework time...what questions are stirring in you? What have you been afraid to ask? What would happen if you gave yourself permission to ask and trust? Like Jacob, we may not get quick answers. and we may walk away feeling it, however we will also walk away transformed. Lean into you and question everything. By asking the questions, that resurrection is already at work in you.

# The Bulletin Board

# Following the Progress of FCC's Leaders

Church leaders met Monday, March 10, in a regularly scheduled meeting to discuss a few upcoming changes in church business. The following is a brief summary of what was decided:

**Building Insurance Company Change:** Property Chair Phil Poynter brought a recommendation to the Board for a vote to change building insurance providers from Brotherhood Mutual to Church Mutual. Brotherhood's annual premium quote is \$21,369 and a building value of \$3.5 million, with a 1% deductible on wind and hail. Church Mutual's quote is \$17,400, guaranteed for a year, with a building value of \$4.5 million and with a 1% deductible on wind and hail. The monthly savings would be \$325. Board Moderator Jason Ripple asked if the quoted price was likely to continue past the one year guarantee. Phil responded that at this time we don't know, but that they were told that Brotherhood's premium will be going up due to insurance premiums in general being increased, though timing for the increase was unspecified. A vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

**Custodian hours to change:** Pastor Gina Johnson reported that Custodian Peggy Dowis has requested a reduction in allotted hours from 15 to 12 for two reasons: she does not need the full amount of hours to complete the tasks and she plans to begin drawing Social Security soon will need to adjust her income to match their requirements. For those times when extra cleaning is required, Peggy's hours will be made flexible to accommodate that. Pastor Gina let the Board know Peggy has done an excellent job and she has full confidence that the reduction in time will not change that.

**New Business:** Property Chair Phil Poynter reported that the Property Team is looking into possibly leasing the van barn as storage space. If that decision is made, then a rental lease would be drafted with the renter be required to provide their own renter's insurance so we're not assuming liability. The question of replacing the church sign at the Northeast corner of the building that blew down during a recent windstorm was tabled in deference to keeping church spending within already budgeted plans. Board Moderator Jason Ripple reported that he fixed the brass memorial cup that was in need of repair. Music Director Deena Poynter requested ideas of where to put various items such as cushions for under the bells tables and music stands that have been stored behind the bell choir rail. She would like to have everything moved before she retires in May.

**Minister's Report:** Pastor Gina Johnson reported on the Legacy Sunday celebration March 2 and on the upcoming Graduates' Sunday scheduled for March 30. She will be working with Worship Chair Guy Ebersole on Holy Week plans and other ideas with Music Director Deena Poynter. Currently she is working with a message series and integrating it with a weekly small group study, as well as finding other opportunities to connect within the community.


# A Moment with Your Moderator
